

### WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

In the first part of the Gospel this weekend, no less than three different groups of people ask John the Baptist what they must do for the coming of the Lord (Luke 3:10-18). There are "the crowds [of people]", "tax collectors" and "soldiers" who similarly voice the same question: "what should we do?"

Make no mistake about it: John's answer to the critical question is not found in pious actions or sentimental musings. Instead, the Baptist clearly explains that they will respond to the ways of God by *being whom they were created and called to be to their neighbors*.

Interestingly, neither the tax collectors nor the soldiers are told by the Baptist to abandon their ways of living. Instead, they are to *share surplus with the poor*, *exact only what is due*, *inflict no violence and intimidation*. While the world will never be without soldiers and tax collectors, they – together with all people - must *develop a sense of belonging to others and responsibility for others*.

John the Baptist looks back to God's original plan: men and women made in God's image are to care for one another. He also looks forward to the person of Jesus whose teaching, life, death and resurrection set a pattern of self-giving love which forms the basis for all Christian life.

With the fire and baptism of the Holy Spirit, a new community has been forged. We belong to this new society. Like the early Christian community, so, too, do we sincerely strive to be emboldened by Jesus' ways in the midst of the rising tide of hostilities and indifferences. Heed the message of today's Gospel text: those opposed and apathetic to the Gospel of Christ and His Church liken "chaff" that will be burned eternally by "unquenchable fire."

Recalling the retirement experience of my great-uncle, I have invited Father Tom to discover a home with us and to share with us his wonderful priestly presence. Aside from his poor choice of rooting for the Yankees, Father Tom is an outstanding priest and faithful friend to all whom he meets. 
